It'll be good to have \$4,000.

Art: Are funding requests and sponsorships looked at the same way?

Shaz: It's the same thing but the policy is different. RSO's are student run and student led. It's a differentiation.

Roshni: What is up with the Womyn of Color Conference?

Shaz: It's not happening this year.

Rachel: It happens every two years.

Shaz: Someone has to put a bid for it.

Tony: UCSA has SOCC and SLC.

## IVC and CoD request for Student Programming

Max: Charlsie and I are asking yall to move funding for events. I will talk about UCSC's got talent from last year and Holi festival. UCSC Got Talent was very successful. We had a lot of great judges. Shaz and Alma were judges. It packed the house. I'm glad the fire marshal didn't show up. A lot of great outreach. The event was costly, it cost around \$4,000. We hope to bring it back. I hope to use \$1,000 from my line and another \$3,000 from student programming.

Charlsie: The Holi Festival ended up being more expensive. We had to hire police officer. Security said to bring sunglasses. I have preliminary budgets. It will be about 7,300. I'm asking for \$2,500.

Art: What is Holi Festival?

Charlsie: 18 bags of 50 pound powder. Tickets are 6 dollars if you buy it early. Entire proceeds will be donated.

Sam: To where?

Charlsie: Haven't decided yet.

Ghandi: Doesn't this line item have to have officers collaborate with each other?

Shaz: That's what I was just thinking.

Max: We have been giving each other advice for events. I've set up meeting for her for the field. She has helped with structure for my event.

Shaz: What is collaboration? I know they have been working together for both events. When you organize the event, there has to be a lead office.

Max: When you look at these events, they are student life events open to everyone. As SUA, we are responsible to put events for everyone. It's to have events.

Ghandi: I was just going off the conversation of last year.

David: Charlsie has been sitting in IVC meetings. There is complete collaboration between the two offices.

Max: Thank you for the presentation. I consider it as faculty doesn't get it. One day have a summer quarter, they don't take into consideration. Buses are short. Prices are expensive. Santa Cruz is gorgeous in the summer. It's the good and the bad. Course offers is what gets people. They have one of my favorite professors.

Tony: Few things I wanted to add, the part there that says demographics to reflect CA's diversity. To clarify online education, 10 million dollars to research on what it would do, Brown allocated \$60 mil for new ways to educate. The last point, international students and out-of-state, do you want more international and out-of-state students here?

Ghandi: We had a testimony, they pay significantly more, and they are used as a revenue stream. At the same time, we don't just want to bring in students for bringing in students. We want to make sure they are successful here. We will get 50-60 students from Punjab to get them here and increase our prestige.

Tony: As much as I appreciate that, I still don't find it fair that we are calling them cash cows basically and trying to fund our education off their high fees. At the end of the day, we are a public university. We have to make sure we focus on California. Maybe reassess that. We are driving away people because of the high cost.

Ghandi: I share the same concerns, if we don't get these students up; our school is going to lose our money. All these goals won't possible.

Roshni: This presentation really hit home for me. Busses sucked. As a student over the general school year, financial aid office was annoying. The fact there is no financial aid or the cost of summer session, there is also a lack of student life. There was nobody here this summer. I would like to see more programming. Summer session, the people who do say, people don't enroll at school here but go to Cabrillo. Cabrillo has the issue of over enrollment. Affect the buses. The housing is an issue. It's funky, and the dining hall plans are funky. They usually sublease a place and that is a completely different hassle. There should be a change in housing. Summer session, I took math 11b and it was taught by a graduate student. I would like to see an increase in faculty seriousness. AMS 5, I know people that tried enrolling in that, I got it on my first try summer session last year. It is really difficult to sit in class for 3 hours. The fall quarter is now starting in October, now my lease extends to September and it's confusing. How do I avoid paying a lease for one month?

### Master Plan

Tony: This resolution has been passed by a few bodies. It is basically set up by 1960, basically envision what the UC looks like and make sure it accessible and a track for students to get a education at an affordable rate. Before we go into this, the master plan promised our education is free. That ended cause of Reagan. The second thing is that it should reflect the population of California.
