Tama: If we give them this money to send people to this national conference, will we be acknowledged or will this just be a goodwill gesture?

Alejandro: I'm pretty sure this is a goodwill gesture since it will be used only for transportation cost.

Tias: The transfer has already been made to our account, so it would not bounce back. There is a possibility that they can't use it for anything and it would just sit there if we motion to not give them the money.

Grace: I do think this is a unique opportunity. It was inspiring when I went to the festival so I think it would be good to support it even if it is 5 people. It would be good for them to have this experience to reflect on for UCSC. Plus we already put it into the budget. it would make a lasting impact and we can just ask them to thank us in a post.

Nicki: It is a competition but the team does come back and do workshops for teams here and help with the slams. It will help other students throughout the year and they do have newsletter and social media so they can do a shoutout to SUA

Hector: In the SOFA deliberation we kind of came to an agreement that if it wasn't impacting a lot of student it would be lower on our priority list and we did that to all the different groups. For that reason I'm not happy but given the situation it would be appropriate to fund them the money. Just that in the future be aware that others had the same constraints

Resolution Calling for UCOP Statement on Mishandling of Title IX Assault Cases 8:46PM

Judith: A resolution asking for the president's statement on title 9 assault cases.

- 2015, 5 UC's including santa cruz was inspected for rape/assault cases and misconduct. UCSC ignored complaints from students and faculty members
- A lot of people have resigned due to sexual assault charges and we need disciplinary action so that these people are not allowed to resign before formal accusations
- UCSA draft a letter to address this case and it was sponsored and passed by UCSA recently. Just know that we are doing the best we can to get things done for people to be accountable for the misdemeanor.

Socorro: Is there anything that our colleges and organizations can do to pressure the resolution?

Judith: Not that I know of, the resolution passed this Sunday and we are currently trying to schedule a meeting with the Chancellor's office.

Socorro: Would you need like signatures or support so that there is a larger student body supporting and trying to pressure this into happening faster.

Judith: I agree, thank you that is a really good point I would say we would definitely keep in touch and talk after meeting try to make sure and know where we are going with this.

Alejandro: The main purpose of this resolution is to get a statement out of student regents and office of the president?

Judith: We are asking UCSA to draft a letter urging UCOP to come up with statement and or urging them to give concrete solutions to prevent this in the future

Vicente: On Feb 15 9:30AM we will go for about 3 hours until 12 will have a seminar in charles hindler lounge to address this issue.
