To the Student Union Assembly,

Under my duties as a College Ten Representative of the Student Union Assembly and Article III, Section A.11 of the SUA Constitution, I present my March 2015 monthly report and evaluation to the Assembly. I will report each month that details the issues, events, and programs that happened that month at College Ten, and evaluates SUA and provides constructive criticism.

Since the start of the 2015 Winter quarter, College Ten Senate has begun meeting at 6pm every Thursday in the Terry Freitas Café for weekly meetings instead of 8pm which was the original meeting time during the 2014 Fall quarter.

The College Ten Senate meeting scheduled for Thursday, March 5<sup>th</sup> was cancelled due to protests blocking entrances to the campus that day.

The College Ten Social Justice class hosted an education equality event on Wednesday, March 4<sup>th</sup> from 6:45pm – 8:30pm in the College Nine and College Ten Multipurpose Room. Also the Street Food, Street Art, and Street Performance College Night was held on Wednesday, March 11<sup>th</sup> from 6pm-8pm in the College Nine and College Ten Multipurpose Room. Two events were hosted on Thursday, March 12<sup>th</sup>, one was Cardio Kickboxing at 8pm in the College Nine and College Ten Multipurpose Room and the other was “Jammin’ with Terry”, a night of relaxation and expression through music, which was held at 8:30pm in the Terry Freitas Café. Official Study Hall for finals began on Friday, March 13<sup>th</sup> in the Recreation Lounge where snacks were provided for students. The following day, Saturday, March 14<sup>th</sup>, was Pi Day and in honor an event was held in the Namaste Lounge at 8pm where a variety of pies were served to students and guests for free.

The College Ten Senate voted in favor of the UCSC Student Health Fee Referendum being put on the ballot for the upcoming elections. As was mentioned in a previous report for the month of February the College Ten Senate has participated in a readership project for years. This project includes free newspapers from the New York Times, U.S. Day Today, and the San Francisco Chronicle in the College Nine and College Ten mailrooms and the dining hall for students. College Ten made a newspaper fund of \$1,000, but was asked to fund more considering an unexpected raise in costs for the newspapers.

Currently the senate is looking into some other options that would offer the same service to students without raising the amount of funding required.

A Sunday Funday Committee and Budget Committee were formed for the College Ten Senate. The Sunday Funday Committee would focus of creating an outreach program regarding elections and to come up with the logistics for an event that would generate greater student interest to vote in the upcoming elections in the spring. The Budget Committee would review the budget process, approve the budget for the next fiscal year, and create a budget survey for people who have received funding from the College Ten Senate in the past. The purpose of the budget survey is to see how organizations used the

money funded to them by the senate, whether the amount was sufficient for the event/program they put on, and whether they think more funding would improve the quality of their event/program.

The College Ten Senate also received detailed report backs from SUA, SCOC, SUGB, SFAC, Academic Senate, and Core Council representatives.

At the last College Ten Senate meeting of the 2015 Winter quarter which was on Thursday, March 12<sup>th</sup> it was decided by the senators and officers in attendance that the meeting time for College Ten Senate for the upcoming 2015 Spring quarter would be changed back to 8pm on Thursday which was the original meeting time during the 2014 Fall quarter.
