## February review areas of improvements:

• The Officer dynamic is not cohesive and it is rather visible by students at large. Students feel more comfortable approaching SUA Representatives with questions and concerns, rather than approaching SUA Officers. Students see little to no collaboration among the Officers and Representatives.

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- Again, a greater amount of cohesive and effective interaction within the Assembly and the campus is needed. It is my hope that future SUA interaction with student organizations begins with those organizations that have voting rights in the SUA.
- To once again reiterate previous sentiments, SUA voting members should consider the voices of their respective constituents, and not only rely on their own personal views or those of their college government alone, when discussing and voting on agenda items. Representatives should be ready for dialogue and discussion at each meeting with their constituent's voices in mind.
- It is the intent of the organization to see increased SUA Officer interaction among each other and with student organizations. It remains evident that communication has been lax. In addition, the SUA should make efforts to further publicize and make transparent any and all funding calls when SUA can and may provide funding to campus student organizations.
