    - First woman to ever run for this vacate Congressional seat
    - Originally from Ohio, growing up in impoverished circumstances
    - Studied Political Science
    - Spent 7 years as Naval Officer
    - Additional 2 year assignment in Persian Gulf enforcing UN Sanctions on Iraq
    - Participated in numerous localized government positions
    - Questions
      - (Tama) Question regarding immigration reform specifically regarding Casey Lucius' immigration platform
        - (Casey) Less monitoring and less ICE sectionality on UC campus
        - Reaching immigration reform on a non-partisan way, stresses local agriculture as largest vector into comprehensive immigration reform
        - Eliminate visa cap from Department of Immigration, allow Department of Agriculture to set caps
        - Student visas to be distributed in an efficient manner to minors looking to study
      - (Thomas) Question regarding Lucius' platform difference from Democratic candidate
        - (Casey) Raised Democratic, studied Political Science and realized that traditional Democratic platforms are not economically comprehensive
        - Self-labeled "New-age Republican"
